In Defense of Christians Action is assessing Senators on the Armed Services Committee, Foreign Relations Committee, and the Subcommittee on State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs of the Appropriations Committee.

Senators will receive points for co-sponsoring and/or voting for the following pieces of legislation:

- [S.727 - Global Fragility Act of 2019](#)
- [S.Res.150 - A resolution expressing the sense of the Senate that it is the policy of the United States to commemorate the Armenian Genocide through official recognition and remembrance](#)
- [S.2641 - Promoting American National Security and Preventing the Resurgence of ISIS Act of 2019](#)
- [S.J.Res.69 - A joint resolution supporting a Diplomatic Solution in Yemen and Condemning the Murder of Jamal Khashoggi](#)

Some Senators have also received points for unique actions they have taken, outside of legislation, to support Christians in the Middle East. These actions are reflected on their scorecards.

Senators will lose points for the following:

- Opposing the U.S. alliance with the Lebanese Armed Forces (through co-sponsoring [S.1886 - Countering Hezbollah in Lebanon's Military Act of 2019](#))
- Obstructing pro-Middle Eastern Christian Legislation (Multiple Senators tried to prevent the Senate from voting on Armenian Genocide recognition and Senator Rand Paul attempted to prevent the Senate from voting on [H.R.390 - Iraq and Syria Genocide Relief and Accountability Act of 2018](#) and [S.1158 - Elie Wiesel Genocide and Atrocities Prevention Act of 2018](#) in the 115th Congress)
